DID YOU KNOW...

- The lowest recorded temperature in WV is -37°F in Lewisburg? (Dec 30, 1917)
- Over 5 feet of snow has been recorded in one snowstorm in WV?
- **Tornadoes** regularly impact West Virginia? (11 documented in Kanawha County alone)
- Almost **half of flood-related deaths** in West Virginia are the result of people driving into flood water?
- YOU can help folks understand and prepare better for the wild weather of the future?

What is the difference between weather and climate?

"Climate is what you expect, weather is what you get."

"Weather is what you experience when you step outside on any given day. In other words, it is the state of the atmosphere at a particular location over the short-term. Climate is the average of the weather patterns in a location over a longer period of time, usually 30 years or more." Source: <u>NOAA website</u>
